MARGINALIZED AND EXCLUDED POPULATION AND HEALTH AND SOCIAL CARE — A SHAMEFUL STATE OF AFFAIRS OF BOTH DEVELOPING AND DEVELOPED COUNTRIES

"Marginalized people are marginalized only because of governments abrogate responsibility and let them stay at the edge of the society" says January issues of Lancet the most respectful journal in Europe in Health and Social Sciences, adding that this phenomenon of last 20 – 30 years should be addressed more frequently not only in commercial society but also in medical field and community and science. (1-3). Current issue of this journal analyzes health and social needs in the most vulnerable marginalized population inside of EU, such as:

- Homeless
- Prisoners, drug addicts
- Migrants/adoptees
- Elderly and chronically ill

In addition to developing countries such as: Refugees, displaced Orphans, street children HIV positive marginalized Malnourished/famine victims

Spectrum of social assistance and healthcare of those groups represent normal and logic solidarity of developed (EU, USA, Asia Pacific) to developing world (Africa, South-East Asia). However, concern from poor dental health (5), TB, HIV, HCV, scabies (4-5) and other non-communicable epidemic diseases (diabetes, hypertension, astma) should be studied (5-6).
